Poznają pojęcia Slavia Orthodoxa, Slavia Romana i Slavia Islamica oraz związane z nimi tradycje kulturowe. Zapoznają się z klasyfikacją i typologią języków słowiańskich w ujęciu konfrontatywnym. Kurs zamyka podsumowanie informacji na temat slawistyki jako dziedziny wiedzy.
