It is essential for him to understand the state's role in the market economy properly. Microeconomic knowledge is to be the basis for taking independent entrepreneurial actions. During the module, a strong emphasis will be placed on the evolution of the Polish economic system after 1990, focusing on Poland's accession to the EU.
