<b>Description</b>	The aim of the course is to familiarize students with the issues of ADR in consumer cases. Students will gain knowledge of the legal bases of consumer ADRs, authorized entities, relevant procedures and the importance of these proceedings. 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	law will be analyzed. Theoretical analyses will be accompanied by practice: preparing files and documents, solving problems and cases, and conducting discussions.
