Understanding the Anthropocene requires an understanding of how biological systems function (from cells to ecosystems, to modern environmental threats, climate issues, natural resources, and many other natural issues) as well as an understanding of the rudiments of technical and technological knowledge. It is crucial to know and understand how technological development, especially in the areas of energy, green technologies, modern materials or everyday life (e.g. food production) can change the nature of human impact and support the way we care for the environment.
