Underlying the area are the conviction that education within each academic discipline should be correlated with the awareness of the changing relation between a person and a citizen, between private and collective life, between a political and a non-political subject, etc. The area of "Civil Society and Entrepreneurship" can be pursued by a student within modules dominated by an academic teacher as well as those where the responsibility for achieving the learning outcomes lies mainly with the student, e.g. civil society in action (projects combining social and natural sciences, combining social sciences and humanities, or combining social sciences, mathematics, physics and chemistry) or social participation in practice. The choice from the range of the above-mentioned modules allows for a high individualization of the education process.</p>
